Western colonialism - Western colonialism - Economic imperialism: The father of the economic interpretation of the new imperialism was the British liberal economist John Atkinson Hobson. In his seminal study, *Imperialism, a Study* (first published in 1902), he pointed to the role of such drives as patriotism, philanthropy, and the spirit of adventure in advancing the imperialist cause.
