A discourse marker is a particle (such as oh, like, and you know) that is used to direct or redirect the flow of conversation without adding any significant paraphrasable meaning to the discourse . Also known as DM, discourse particle, discourse connective,

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pragmatic marker, or pragmatic particle. In most cases, discourse markers are syntactically independent: that is, removing a marker from a sentence still leaves the sentence structure intact.

Definition and Examples of Discourse Markers

Discourse markers organise longer pieces of conversation or text.

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They can mark the openings or closings of conversations, changes in topics, and other functions connected with organising a conversation or text. Most discourse markers belong to the class of adverbs.
