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Providing Feedback to Teachers

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Good feedback can be a powerful way to help teachers to become (even) more effective, writes Rob Coe We know effective feedback is incredibly powerful for students! learning (Hattie and Timperley, 2007) and supporting task performance much more generally (Kluger and DeNisi, 1996; London, 2003). This is as true for teachers as for students.

**How can we ensure teachers receive effective feedback?**

Side-by-side coaching gives teachers real-time feedback and the ability to reflect and correct right away when something comes up. This can be intense for the coach and the teacher, and can at times be a little awkward, but it does have great results and helps to change practices more quickly. Giving feedback to teachers is not a simple process.

**Feedback and reporting**

A student should be able to read or hear their teacher's feedback and then do something very specific and concrete that will improve their learning.

**Effective teacher-student feedback practices**
