The study by Shahinfar et al. (2000) provides an example of the discrepancy between child self-report and parent report on the Violence Exposure Scale for Children (VEX), one of the selected measures. The authors administered the VEX to preschool children and their parents to assess for exposure to community violence and found no statistically significant relationship between child and parent reports.

Review of Tools for Measuring Exposure to Adversity in??

This is the VEX-R?, the Violence Exposure Scale for Children - Revised (Full Scale Version) which was revised in 1995. However, validity and reliability data are not yet available. A modified version of the My ETV instrument is being developed and piloted among children ages 6-8 years (FJ Earls, personal communication) however reliability and validity data are not yet available.

Exposure to Violence—MacArthur SES & Health Network

Methods. The Violence Exposure Scale for Children-Revised (VEX-R) and the Substance Exposure Assessment (SXA) were given to 104 children participating in a longitudinal study of in-utero cocaine exposure (IUCE) at age 8.5, 9.5, and 11 years. Survival analyses evaluated the association of the quartile of VEX total score (higher scores indicating more violence exposure) at age 8.5 years, with time to first report of their own and their friends' use of ATOD from age 8.5-11 years.

Pre-adolescents' report of exposure to violence

A lesser known scale that addresses children's exposure to domestic violence is the Victimization Scale (Nadel et al., 1996) as found in the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's compendium of assessment tools Measuring Violence-Related Attitudes, Beliefs, and Behaviors Among Youths (Dahlberg, Toal, & Behrens, 1998).

Assessing child exposure to adult domestic violence??

Given the nature and complexity of children's exposure to parental IPV, a comprehensive assessment of contextual factors is critical (Mohr and Tulman, 2000). To address the lack of measures specific to children's experience of parental IPV, Edleson et al. developed the Child Exposure to Domestic Violence (CEDV) Scale. The CEDV is a child self-report measure consisting of forty-two items that are divided into three sections with six subscales.

Systematic Review of the Child Exposure to Domestic??

The KID-SAVE (Flowers et al., 2000) is a measure of violence exposure for children in grades 3 through 7. The scale consists of 34 items loading onto three subscales: Traumatic Violence, Indirect Violence, and Physical/Verbal Abuse.
